a call from someone who told her that her comput- er had a virus. The caller offered to fix it for a fee. The woman gave the call- er a credit card number. The next day her cred- it card company called to tell her there were three charges to her account made from India. She also discovered that her com- puter had a virus, thanks to the scammer who got control of the device.

This article highlights an example of how scammers can take advantage of unsuspecting computer users. This person fell victim to a 'Phishing' scheme in which the scammer attempts to gain access to your computer and obtain your credit card number by planting a seed of doubt about your computer's security

Your phone number and your internet address are different; a random caller can't associate one with the other.

If you are in doubt, have you computer checked by a trusted information technology professional with whom you initiate the contact.
